Are you visiting today?

As part of our summer worship we started going “old school” in our worship bulletins. Rather than preparing full-text bulletins with every word spoken or sung printed in a bulletin, we are providing a small menu-style bulletin that refers to the page numbers of our Book of Common Prayer (BCP), and the numbers of our music.

Our primary hymnal is The Hymnal 1982. If you see music that begins with the letter S (S-129, S-280, etc.) those pieces are found in the front of the 1982 Hymnal. Additional hymns are found in two other hymnals: Lift Every Voice and Sing (LEVAS) and Wonder, Love, and Praise (WLP).

If it feels a little daunting at first, consider asking someone to help. You might also just relax and trust that you know more of the service than you think and don’t need to turn to every page.

Hey, What Happened to the Bulletin Being a Summer Experiment?

After Trinity Sunday our 10:30 worship bulletin changed from a “full-text” bulletin to a “menu bulletin,” meaning it went from having all the songs, readings, and prayers printed in the bulletin to having a small piece of paper with page numbers to the prayer book and hymnals. When we first started doing it I introduced it to you as a summer experiment and part of our “summer of rest.”

So why is it still here in September and how long will it be around? It’s still around because of the largely positive feedback I got from several worshipers. Many folks enjoy opening their prayer books and hymnals and going back to that muscle memory of flipping back and forth from one book to the other. So I decided to keep it around a little longer.

But not everyone loves it, and I know that for some the full-text bulletin is easier to navigate. So I’ve decided to go with the full-text bulletin starting on the First Sunday of Advent (November 27) and stick with it through Trinity Sunday 2023 (June 4), then back to the menu bulletin for Ordinary Time.

A part of the experiment was also to not print the scripture readings of the day. My hope was that we would be nudged to be more careful listeners to the lessons instead of relying on the printed page. Ultimately, the scriptures are meant to be proclaimed in worship, not read silently. But starting this Sunday we’ll be having inserts with the readings and psalm for each Sunday.

Every type of bulletin has benefits and drawbacks, and those of you who have been here as long as I know that I am a bit of a tinkerer when it comes to bulletins.
