### National Day of Prayer May 2

### Film Screening on Creation Care and Climate Action - June 5

Make plans to come to supper and the screening of a powerful documentary on regenerative agriculture, "Common Ground," from 5:45 to 8 p.m., Wednesday, June 5. A faith-based discussion follows.

"Common Ground" is a sequel to "Kiss the Ground," which documented a return to soil-friendly farming that is practical, profitable and a natural counterweight to the greenhouse effects of fossil fuel use.

The movie, an hour and 40 minutes, will be followed by a discussion led by Sam Collier, local attorney and shareholder advocate for decarbonization, and parishioner Doug Cumming. IPL also offers an abundance of other actions, such as garden blessings and political action for equity in addressing climate change and offering real hope against climate collapse. Our prayer is that the web of life be mended and our world be transformed with new steps toward life.
