Miserere mei, Gregorio Allegri

One of the most haunting and iconic pieces in choral music, the Allegri has evolved over time, from its composition during Holy Week in 1638 to its current version and popularity for the unique soprano high C.

March 30 - Easter Vigil

The Word was God, Rosephanye Powell Sicut cervus, Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina A joyful alleluia, Gordon Young

As always, there is a lot of music to enjoy at this rich liturgy. The Exsultet is sung, we respond musically to the story of our salvation, and we sing music from across the centuries, hymns of joy as we begin to celebrate the resurrection.

March 31 - Easter Day

A song to the Lamb, Gerre Hancock

From the organist-composer who led the music and choir school at St. Thomas Church in New York City for over 30 years, this exciting and festive piece features brass and timpani, with the choir singing Canticle 18.

May 9, 7 pm - Evensong for Ascension Day

On this principal feast, the choir will repeat last year's premiere of *The New Zealand Evening Service*. Music, composed by Will Buthod, is based on the New Zealand Prayer Book, and incorporates elements of both Anglican tradition and Maori music. This is one of the only settings of this liturgy currently in existence.

May 19 - Pentecost

I'm gonna sing when the Spirit moves in my heart, Moses Hogan You will enjoy this lively classic from the late Moses Hogan, as it employs elements of Spirituals in a rhythmically vibrant texture.

May 26 - Trinity Sunday

Laus Trinitati, Faith Morgan

Morgan's newly composed Trinitarian anthem, based on a text by Hildegard von Bingen, is quickly spreading through choirs around the U.S., because of its quality of sounding both ancient and modern at the same time.

From Brahms' A German Requiem, and sung in English, this is one of the most beautiful movements ever composed for a choral requiem, as we turn our focus to the saints in heaven.

Let all the world in every corner sing, Ralph Vaughan Williams

This exciting piece comes from this English composer's set, *Five Mystical Songs*, all based on the poetry of George Herbert.

From a British royal composer, this penitent piece based on Psalm 25 reflects on God's mercy and kindness, and has become a choral standard today.

March 24 - Palm Sunday

When I survey the wondrous cross, Gilbert Martin

This moving setting of the hymn is popular with choirs around the world, with its sensitive setting of the text and the momentum towards hope in the end, perfect as we begin our journey with Jesus to the cross.

March 28 - Maundy Thursday

Mandatum novum, Luke Mayernick Ubi caritas, Maurice Duruflé Ave verum corpus, Edward Elgar

These three gorgeous anthems echo the themes of the "new commandment" and our connection to each other through love.
