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PROPOSED 2024 BUDGET OVERVIEW

THE RECTOR

The rector is called to oversee the spiritual affairs of the parish, serving as the priest of the church and the senior pastor. The rector chairs the vestry, as it provides vision and oversight for the parish. Additionally, the rector supervises the clergy and staff and oversees worship, pastoral care, and use of the buildings. Finally, the rector serves as the chair of the preschool board, and takes his/her place in the councils of the diocese.

Holy Trinity gathers in worship and praise of God over 200 times per year. Our principal act of worship is to gather on Sundays at 8:00 and 10:30 for Holy Eucharist. On Wednesdays we have Preschool Chapel followed by an 11 am Healing Service. Throughout the year we have special services such as Evensong, Holy Week, and Principal Feasts of the Church, and we also gather for weddings and funerals. We live-stream our Sunday 10:30 service and we offer Morning & Evening Prayer online. Once a month, Holy Trinity's clergy lead worship at Park Springs Senior Living Community. We are also proud to host the Gift of God Eritrean Church for their Sunday worship services.



Minister of Music

Will Buthod is Holy Trinity's pianist, organist, resident composer, and conductor. We rejoice that after 5 years at Holy Trinity the vestry approved a well-deserved market-based raise for Will for his next 5 years with HTP.

Children & Youth in Worship

Children & youth are precious and we want them to know they belong at Holy Trinity Parish. Through baptism they are fully initiated into Christ's body and the Church is not whole without them. Our proposed 2024 Worship budget continues to fund our Children's Choir, our acolyte program, and our nursery, to support our youngest parishioners' presence and participation in worship.

Formation is essential for the spiritual maturity and longevity of the church and we're so thankful to God that after the pandemic these programs regained their footing under the leadership of HTP's **Associate Rector Fr. Rhett Solomon.**

Children's Formation received a substantial increase in funding in 2023 as HTP re-established our **Godly Play** program. In the proposed 2024 budget, HTP continues to allocate necessary resources to support our three Godly Play classrooms and their volunteers, to fund a part-time **Children's Minister** position, as well as fund the various children's formation events that occur throughout the year.

Youth Formation will continue under the leadership of our **Youth Minister, Christian Foster.** The 2024 programming includes **formation** that engages the Bible, our Book of Common Prayer, our liturgy, the Episcopal tradition, and the wider Church and world. The youth will continue to nurture **fellowship** with youth at the Episcopal Church of the Epiphany and the Ismaili Civic Center. Finally, HTP's youth will have **fun** as they eat, play, and travel together.

Young Adults The 3rd Thursday of every month from 6 - 8pm, HTP's young adults (ages 21 to 40-ish) host a gathering at the home of one of our young adults or a young adult couple. They share potluck supper and fellowship from 6 - 7pm. Then, prayer and discussion from 7 - 8pm.

Adult Formation continues to offer a variety of classes throughout the week. Meeting weekly on Sundays from 9:15 – 10:15 am are the Life in Christ Class, the Men's Room, and the Going Deeper classes. Throughout the year, the Brotherhood of St. Andrew, the Daughters of the King, the Contemplative Prayer group, and the Mystics Book Study group meet regularly.

Holy Trinity hopes to renew its small groups in 2024, including Sacred Ground and seasonal book studies.


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ADMINISTRATION



their material needs. We are deeply thankful to **David Triemer,** HTP's Outreach Chair as well as the entire Outreach Committee for their leadership, generous and open hearts, and in how they help Holy Trinity serve our neighbors.

We define **Evangelism** as proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ in our communities and helping newcomers integrate as active members of the Body of Christ. Mo. Ellen Echols Purdum leads both our Evangelism and Newcomer efforts. We are thankful for her work as well as the Giles Bequest that funds her position and ministry budget.

Holy Trinity founded Holy Trinity Parish Preschool (HTPP) as an outreach initiative of the parish. Over the last few years, Director Kate Hoppin has worked diligently to ensure HTPP's financial independence in its operational expenses. The preschool's budget is approved by the vestry and passed by the preschool board, of which Fr. Greg is the chair. Holy Trinity will continue to provide support through maintenance and care of our facilities, but the staff salaries, benefits, supplies, and operational costs are all covered by the tuition of children attending HTPP.

FELLOWSHIP & PASTORAL CARE

Our Fellowship & Pastoral Care budget may be small in amount, but the human hours lovingly and faithfully poured into these ministries cannot be counted.

Our **Fellowship Teams** include Parish Life, Coffee Hour volunteers, and those who assist with our Foyers Groups and our Parish Retreat at Camp Mikell. Whether it's our Trinity Sunday luncheon, Easter Brunch, Wassail served after Lessons & Carols, or simply coffee and donuts to share after our Sunday services, we thank all our parishioners who have volunteered their time to wash dishes, make coffee, cook, and plan the events and traditions that allow our parish to strengthen our relationships over food and fun.

Holy Trinity has four **Lay Pastoral Care Captains**: Nancy Boone, Judy Skinner, Joan Kidd, and Paulette Braithwaite. Each of these captains, one week a month, oversee the lion's share of pastoral visitation and communication. We cannot adequately express our thanks for their faithful attention and care serving the parishioners of Holy Trinity.

DIOCESAN PLEDGE

Holy Trinity Parish is a member of the Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta led by the Right Rev. Robert Wright, our diocese's 10th Bishop. The diocesan budget is funded primarily by congregational giving. Every parish pledges 10% of its revenue, based upon a rolling three-year average. The Diocese of Atlanta is one church with 120 worshipping communities across middle and north Georgia.

GILES BEQUEST

With a few simple lines of text on the final will and testament of long-time HTP Parishioner Patricia Giles, Holy Trinity Parish became the stewards of a major bequest for the **outreach of the church.**

Since the Giles Bequest was received in 2022, Holy Trinity has given away \$70,000 in gifts and grants. Part of the Giles Bequest supplements our **Outreach & Evangelism** budgets, including Mo. Ellen Purdum's position and program costs. The vestry also commissioned the **Giles Bequest Committee** (**GBC**) chaired by Nancy Qarmout to seek outreach initiatives from people outside the Parish, help them clarify their ideas, and advise the vestry on supporting them. An application for Giles Bequest funds is on Holy Trinity's Website.

The Giles Bequest is managed by Holy Trinity's **Investment Committee** chaired by parishioner Joe Foley. While the gift totaled \$6,641,129 when it was received in 2022, it's grown to a total of \$6,793,354 as of the end of September 2023, thanks to the careful management decisions of the Investment Committee as approved by the vestry. The vestry and wider parish remain in a time of discernment to ensure this amazing gift is wisely managed and faithfully used for the greater good of our community and the wellbeing of the Parish.


We believe that **all amounts are generous** and you will play an important role in creatively envisioning your legacy at HTP.
